- Major deliverable for now is the submission for publication of the findings of the survey of publicly funded researchers that is being used to map current practice in pooling multi-database studies. A mature draft was circulated 18 February 2014 for final comment by the WG prior to sending to the researchers surveyed for their input. Taking account of EMA internal review the aim is to submit for publication (BMJ Commentary) end March 2014.
