




1. Role of the Steering Group

Definition and safeguard of ENCePP principles

Decision-making on operational tasks of the network





2. Specific tasks and duties

- Identification of priority actions
- Approval of work programme
- Oversight of activities
- Adjudicator in case of discrepancies or complaints
- Review of ENCePP working model and WG structure
- Champion and promote ENCePP






3. Steering Group Membership

15 members:

- 5 x ENCePP collaborating centres (incl. deputy Chair representing Academia)
- 4 x EMEA (incl. Chair)
- 1 x Heads of Medicines Agencies
- 1 x CHMP
- 1 x PhV WP
- 1 x Patients and Consumers WP
- 1 x ISPE
- 1 x ISoP

2 observers:


- 1 x Int'l Regulatory Agency
- 1 x EFPIA





4. Rules of Procedure

- Commitment to attend (no replacement)
- 4 meetings per year (minimum)
- Quorum: 10 members (two thirds)
- Decision-making by consensus
- Co-opted experts
- Working groups
- Consultation of ENCePP
- Recommendations for change to terms of reference and mandate





5. Selecting Members

3 months

2 weeks

ENCePP Plenary Meeting

- Notice of election
- Submission of applications (incl. resumé and motivation)
- Circulation of list of candidates and their resumés
- Motivation of candidature
- Election (one ballot paper per ENCePP centre – up to five votes)
- Secret ballot; simple majority



Term of Service



- Two years; renewable
- EMEA representatives, stakeholders and ex-officio members: appointed by their respective organisation for the duration of the term of service of the SG (2 years); renewable
 - Deputy Chair (Academia) elected at inaugural meeting
